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3. What should be the next investigation?

A 50 years old diabetic, hypertensive male got admitted with fever & altered level of consciousness, which was sudden on onset associated with irrelevant talking, aggressive behavior. He had convulsion for 3 times associated with tongue bite, urinary incontinence. On examination, he was anxious, confused, anemic. He had bilateral NPDR, GCS was 11/15, diminished deep tendon reflexes with right sided extensor plantar response. There were no signs of meningeal irritation. Other systemic examination was normal. This is the MRI of brain (Fig A, B,C)


