
Medical quiz: images Islam MR^a, Rahman T^b

A 38-year-old lady got admitted with the complaints of sudden, severe, global, dull aching headache with associated bilateral dimness of vision for 5 days. She was anxious with visual acuity 6/60 on both eyes and had bilateral 6th nerve palsy. She had dilated, non-reactive pupil and bilateral relative afferent pupillary

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defect. Fundoscopy revealed bilateral papilledema. Deep tendon reflexes were exaggerated on all four limbs with bilateral extensor plantar responses. Other systemic examination was normal. Computed tomography (CT) brain (Figure 1) and magnetic resonance venography (MRV) of brain (Figures 2, 3) are given below.




