May 2025

- Cutbacks in aid & health funding: The U.S.'s temporary freeze on foreign aid (Jan–Mar 2025) and proposed NIH budget cuts raised alarms for potential disastrous effects on HIV, TB, maternal/child health, and climate-linked programs
- Belize measles outbreak: After decades measles-free, Belize reported **7 confirmed cases** since April 12, with sustained local transmission—underscoring gaps in global immunization.
- Healthcare data breach drop: U.S. hospitals reported 60 data breaches in May—slightly below the average—but 311 incidents since January remain a significant systemic risk

June 2025

 Self-Care Month (June 24–July 24): In support of WHO's global self-care initiatives, new digital tools and competency guides were released to empower self-care in areas like pregnancy and chronic disease

 Gen Z mental health engagement: A UNICEF report shows 1 in 3 Gen Z members are ready to take leadership roles in peer mental health support, despite stigma and awareness gaps

- COVID and vaccine updates: AMA reports confirm that updated COVID-19 vaccines offer 24–29% lower ER/hospital risk, effective up to 299 days post-vaccination. RSV vaccines and new treatments for gonorrhea are also spotlighted
- Cardiovascular mortality drop: In the U.S., ageadjusted heart disease deaths fell by 66% from 1970 to 2022, mainly due to reductions in acute MI and ischemic heart disease

July 2025

 Eco-health crisis warning: The Lancet One Health Commission emphasizes the profound health threats posed by zoonoses, antimicrobial resistance, climate change, and environmental degradation

- Rajasthan TB screening initiative: India's campaign (June 25–July 21) screened 44% of its vulnerable population; ~230,000 suspected TB cases identified—highlighting community-driven TB control efforts.
- Diarrhea prevention drive in Uttar Pradesh: A monsoon health campaign (July 16–31) encouraged ORS, zinc, hygiene, and clean water to curb childhood diarrhea.
- Dengue control in Ludhiana: Proactive surveillance and breeding-site elimination have kept dengue cases extremely low—just 8 cases by mid-July vs. 37 last year.

- UK heatwave & water restrictions: Significant heat-health alerts led to drought declarations and hosepipe bans in England (July 9–15)—underlining climate-health nexus.
- Dublin beach water contamination: Heavy summer rains caused no-swim advisories at 10 Dublin beaches due to bacterial pollution—serving as a reminder of climate-driven waterborne risks.
- COVID summer wave returns: In California, wastewater surveillance indicates rising COVID-19 cases with variants LP.8.1 and XFG; CDC now categorizes national risk as "medium"
