





This is an interesting book probably the first of its kind in Bangladesh. Published by the Department of Medicine of Dhaka Medical College, this book contains the cases that have been presented in the weekly clinical presentation of the department termed Grand Round. The book consists of 50 cases where each has been equipped with salient feature, provisional diagnosis, investigation reports, a final diagnosis and ends with a discussion. The manner in which the book is presented will help medical professionals to go through the problematic cases that they themselves may come across during their medical career and will also help them to build up a thinking process. For the students the book has enough cases to keep their mind thinking and will help them prepare for written and clinical examinations regarding how to present and diagnose similar cases when they come across in their exams. The book also acts as an excellent record in black and white of the difficult cases the department came across last year. The only drawback may be the limited number of illustration which hopefully the editors will keep in mind in the coming editions.
